Water Heater Emergency Shutdown Procedure

very homeowner should know how and where to shut off their water heater. If your water heater is leaking, overheating, or just not working properly, shutting it off can prevent unnecessary damage to your home. Follow the steps below to stop a minor crisis from becoming a major disaster.

To avoid damage from a leaking or

malfunctioning water heater: 1. Turn off gas or electricity:

Gas: Turn top of the dial from the ON position to the OFF position. *Electric:* Switch the circuit breaker for the water heater to the OFF position.

- 2. Turn off water supply: Turn handle clockwise until it stops.
- 3. Drain the water heater if necessary: Attach a garden hose to the drain faucet valve on the water heater and drain water. Turn on a hot water faucet in the house to let air into the tank while draining.
- 4. Call your local plumber as soon as possible.
- In the event of an earthquake or another emergency, if you smell gas:
- 1. Locate the gas meter outside your home.
- 2. Turn the gas valve a guarter turn from the ON position to the OFF position.

Spaghetti Pie

1 lb. ground beef	Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
1 Tbsp. minced garlic 16 oz. prepared pasta sauce	Brown ground beef and garlic in skillet and drain. Combine cooked ground beef and garlic mixture with prepared spaghetti sauce in a large skillet. Cook on low to medium until
1 cup grated parmesan cheese	heated through. Combine beaten eggs and parmesan cheese. Add cooked,
3 eggs, beaten 1 Tbsp. Italian seasoning	drained pasta and toss to coat. Spread pasta mixture on bottom and sides of two 9" glass pie plates. Press firmly to flatten. This will form a pasta pie crust.
16 oz. ricotta cheese	Sprinkle 1/2 Tbsp. Italian seasoning on each 9" pie. Spread half the ricotta cheese evenly on both pasta pie
16 oz. spaghetti pasta, cooked and drained	crusts. Top each pie with half the meat mixture. Cover each pie with 1 cup mozzarella cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes, or until the cheese on top
2 cups mozzarella cheese	starts to brown. Let stand for 5 minutes, cut into wedges, and serve.

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Household Tips Shrink Your Household Expenses

wining a home is exciting and rewarding, but it can also be expensive. Fortunately, there are lots of free ways to compensate for the steadily rising cost of living.

Keep closet doors closed. Doing so will reduce the amount of square footage in your home that you're heating and cooling.

Shorten your dryer vent hose. A shorter, unobstructed line helps your dryer run more efficiently, saving you money on monthly energy costs.



Lower the thermostat on your water heater. Typically, the default temperature is set at 140 degrees, but for most households, water heated to 120 degrees is plenty hot! Be sure to check the owner's manual before making any adjustments.

Wash clothes in cold water. This not only saves energy and money, it also saves fabrics from shrinking or fading. Worried about getting your clothes clean? Cold water detergents use chemical reactions to tackle most stains without the need for scalding water.

Use ceiling fans when it's cold so you don't need to constantly run your furnace. A ceiling fan running clockwise at a low speed will recirculate warm air that naturally rises.

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
